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OLD SETTLER'S ASSN.

Back in September of 1891 a group of Jefferson County residents held a reunion at Bethlehem Church. W.H.H. Thomas was president and R. W. McMulllin served as secretary. The second reunion was held at Hillsboro in September of 1892, and the third one in Herculaneum, Sept 1, 1894. The fourth reunion was held at Plattin, Sept. 6, 1895.

According to the 1895 minutes "after all had partaken of a sumptuous picnic dinner, the committee almost too full for utterance," got their heads together and made some recommendations to the group as a whole.

1. That this association shall be known as the Old Settler's Association of Jefferson County Missouri. 2. That anyone having attained the age of 50 years and having lived in Jefferson County for the past 20 years may become a member by giving their name, age, and time of residence in this county. 3. The object of this association shall be for the purpose of meeting annually to form new acquaintances and strengthen old friendships.

4. Officers shall be a president, vice-president, secretary (who shall also serve as treasurer in case any funds accrue,) and an executive committee composed of one member from each township in the county. The first set of officers were: President: John T. McMullin,

Vice-President: Judge M. F. Byrne, Big River; Secretary-Treasurer, T.S. Byrd, Joachim. Executive Committee: John D. Hearst, Big River; R. W. McMullin, Central; Sumner Jewett, Joachim; N. B. Sullens, Meramec; L.K. Waters, Rock; and Herman Hamel, Valle.

Old Settler's Reunion
Meeting of the Executive Committee, in
DeSoto, Mo.
July 10, 1896.

Committee met at J.L. Farley's office. Present: J.D. Hearst, Sumner Jewett, L.K. Waters, Herman Hamel. Absent, John. T. Byrd, R.W. McMullin and B. Sullens. There were also present, John. T. McMullin, president, and T.S. Byrd, secretary.

After considering the impropriety of holding the reunion on the second day of the Jefferson Co. Fair, as had been recommended at the last annual picnic held at Plattin, a motion placed by H. Hamel and seconded by J.D. Hearst that our next annual reunion be held on the DeSoto Fairgrounds Sept. 26, 1896, was unanimously adopted. H. Hamel and T.S. Byrd were elected committee on arrangements.

Mr. Hamel guaranteed the use of the Fairgrounds, without charge to the O.S.A., and in return for which, Mr. Waters moved that the Fair Association be allowed the rents accruing from the refreshment booths, etc. This motion was adopted. Mr. Hamel having charge of that matter for the Fair Association fits in very nicely for his service on this committee.

The committee then headed a program, which is to be completed by Mr. Hamel and the secretary.

A motion by Mr. Waters as follows was then proposed and carried:- Any games of moral character can be arranged with Mrs. Hamel and Byrd on the grounds or by arranging previously with them.

A suggestion that any one having in his possession any old relics of any description, please bring along to the anniversary on Sept. 26th.

The Executive Committee instructed the secretary that he emphasize in the notices to the county press, the fact that the picnic dinner was to be a free basket dinner.

It being necessary to have a little funds to defray incidental expenses, each member of the executive committee present donated twenty-five cents, making a total of one dollar placed to the credit of the Association.

The Sec'y was instructed to secure a record book in which a minute of all meetings should be kept.

There being no further business to transact, the committee adjourned to meet again at the Jeff. Co. Fairgrounds, Sept. 26, 1896.

INTRODUCING CHARLOTTE

Charlotte Maness has contributed greatly to our Jefferson County history by going through the microfilms of old Jefferson County news-papers and entering items of historical and genealogical interest on her computer. The result is 13 notebooks of information, all indexed which are in the De Soto Public Library collection. This amounts to hours and hours of work. We asked Charlotte to tell us something about herself and so she did.

"By profession I am a surgical technician at St. Anthony's Hospital in Denver, CO, and have been there for 26 years. I grew up listening to my father telling me that he was the 'only one in the family.' When his mother died I came into possession of a huge box of

pictures. Some of them were of MANESS', in Elk Creek, Texas County, MO. One picture in particular was a school picture with seven Maness children in it, including William Riley Maness, my grandfather. That started my trek in the ROOT cellar so to speak. I tracked down those Maness' and found I still had living cousins in Elk Creek. One thing led to another and I eventually ended up in Jefferson County.

What started me on my newspaper project? I originally started looking for a death notice of some kind for my esteemed G-G-grandfather Elijah Maness Jr., who with his father and two of his father's brothers, Ephraim and Elisha Maness/Manis settled in Jefferson County around 1833-35. I have never found a death notice for the 'old man,' and doubt that I ever will because he was a pauper. I did find notice where Elijah's son William Riley Maness (not my grandfather) had been granted \$10.00 to purchase burial clothes for a pauper. What would be more fitting than for a son to bury his father?

One thing led to another and now several years later I am still working on my newspaper. The De Soto Public Library has my 'latest' book on file. My greatest hope is that I have been of some help to my 'friends' there in Missouri. In Denver I am very involved in the Colorado marriage index. We are indexing marriages by bride from 1939-1959. A project that takes a lot of time and patience, but is also very rewarding. I am also involved in the USGenWeb census project and am indexing the 1850 census for Jefferson

County, which will eventually be in the De Soto Library." (CManess@Lescom.org)

NEELY PAUPER CEMETERY

This cemetery is located in the east half of the northwest quarter of Township 40, Range 4, Section 30. Go west on Hgy. Y from De Soto to the intersection of Tin House Road, make a left "south" onto a gravel road directly across from Tin House. Continue down the gravel for about a half mile. The cemetery is on the right (west) side of the road. It is a field one acre in size along the gravel lane.


This tract was owned in 1876 by R. L. Blackmer who had 120 acres and a building on it. In 1898 it was owned by Fritz Glass who had 80 acres and a building on the site. According to a Post Dispatch article by Benjamin Israel, Ralph Krodinger states the property was deeded to the county by the Neely family before his first term of

office in 1971. Krodinger said the Neely family was from St. Louis. "They had buried some of their ancestors there, but they had no use for it so they gave it to us." At this time I do not know where paupers were buried before 1982, but I intend to research this and report on the results.

I obtained the names of those buried there from the County Commission Office at the Courthouse. The list is included in this newsletter. There is also a section in the Hillsboro Cemetery that the County used for pauper graves. That list is also included. Many of these people simply outlived all of their relatives. There was no one left living to bury them. In the case of Carol Mills, when the family learned of her death, they reclaimed the body to give it a proper burial.


